- STEWARDS MAY AT THEIR DISCRETION: Reject work, which is soiled or below standard, reclassify any exhibit not strictly true to the wording of the Class in which it is entered.
- Stewards who are exhibitors must not be in the vicinity of the Judges while they
 are judging. Any breaches will result in entries being disqualified from judging.
- 5. Exhibitors are not allowed more than two (2) entries in any one Class, except in Support Organizations which is one (1) entry per class, per exhibitor.
- 6. All exhibits to be unwashed & not previously exhibited in Dubbo Show Handicrafts Section. Exhibitors who use personal labels please ensure they are covered & unable to be viewed by the judge.
- If you are printing the exhibitor cards from the internet, please ensure that is on white paper card.
- Exhibitors are requested to collect their exhibit cards from the Secretary's Office
 not later than the Tuesday prior to the Show & attach the unnamed section to exhibit.
- 9. Exhibitors posting entries are requested to attach Name & Address to each exhibit & the Class to which each entry is being entered, & instructions for return of exhibits. Exhibits will not be returned without prepaid postage.
- 10. Exhibits in this section to be delivered to the Centenary Pavilion between 8am & 12 noon on Wednesday prior to the show. Judging commences at 1pm Wednesday & continues through to Thursday evening. Judges' decisions in awarding prizes are final. No "For Sale" signs are permitted & there are to be no sale transactions of articles over the period of the show.
- **11.** All entries MUST be the work of exhibitor & entry must be original & not worked from a prepared kit unless specified.
- **12.** Vouchers awarded as prizes cannot be redeemed in cash. Winners of special prizes need not be the Champion.
- 13. Vouchers for special prizes or open orders will be attached to the winning exhibits. All other prize money can be collected at the show office after 3pm on the Friday of the show & prior to 30th June 2024.
- 14. Exhibitors must retain the named section of exhibit card for reclaiming exhibit. This will be essential to assist us with security arrangements for collection (see below).

Please note:

- **15.** Stewards are only permitted to handle gates & exhibits for security reasons.
- 16. Showcase of Excellence: Exhibits displayed in the Showcase are nominated by the Judge/s as examples of excellent workmanship.

17. Where a class identifies exhibitors under 20 years of age, this is restricted to Exhibitors who have not attained the age of 20 by the first day of the current year.

Collection of exhibits:

- **18.** There is to be **NO collection** of any items prior to **5pm on Sunday** through the process explained below. This is not negotiable.
- 19. The Centenary Pavilion will close to the public at 4pm on Sunday with stewards only permitted to remain inside. The pavilion will reopen at 5pm for exhibitors with exhibit tickets only, security staff will be in attendance. No one other than exhibitors will be admitted. Any exhibits not collected by 6pm will be wrapped & identified & can be collected from the show office up to the second Friday after the show.

- 2. Framed & board mounted exhibits not permitted.
- 3. Must be either hand &/or machine pieced & guilted'.
- **4.** Minimal Embellishments. Small amount only not to overpower patchwork.
- **5.** Each exhibit entered must be the bona fide work of the exhibitor.
- **6.** An exhibit having won at a Show will compete at a Group Final.
- 7. An exhibit is only eligible to represent one Society at Group level & one Group at State level
- **8.** If, for any reason, a winner is unable to compete at Group level then the second placegetter is eligible to compete.

 - c) Three Different Types: the 3 items in an entry must differ from each other in terms of their construction technique &/or their purpose eg.1 a knitted jumper, blanket & tea

- cosy OR eg.2 a knitted tea cosy, a crocheted tea cosy or a felted tea cosy OR eg.3 a knitted jumper, a knitted blanket & a crocheted blanket.
- The whole article and/or garment must be constructed of & contain a minimum of 80% SHEEP wool.
- **3.** Exhibits (articles/garments) may be knitted, crocheted, sewn, felted etc & must be hand crafted (use of machine is permitted).
- 4. A sample of the yarn, fabric or fibre with label must be attached to each item making up the exhibit. If a label is not available, such as in the case of a hand spun or felted item, a handwritten label with relevant details & sample will suffice.
- 5. An exhibit in this competition may consist of the work of one individual or a group of individuals, or an organization.
- **6.** All three article/garments must have been completed within the 12 months prior to the local show & made by the exhibitor/s.
- 7. An exhibit having won at a local show may be exhibited (the same three article/garments) at the Group Final. The winning exhibit at the Group Final is then eligible to compete in the State Final.
- 8. An exhibit is only eligible to represent one Society at Group level & one Group at State level
- 9. An exhibit (article/garment) that has previously competed at Group level is not eligible to compete again.
- 10. If this class is not scheduled or attracts no entries at a local show, the Chief Pavilion Steward in consultation with the appropriate Pavilion Section Judges, may select three suitable individual exhibits &, with the exhibitor's permission, enter them in the Group judging as an exhibit representing the particular Society concerned.
- **11.** It is the responsibility of the Group Secretary & winner to co-ordinate the transfer of the winning entry to the ASC Office in Sydney for the State judging.
- **12**. Recommendation: State Final garments are to include a photo of the garment being worn (where possible & applicable).
